The priorities of Acadiana Legal Service Corporation are as follows:

- •Preservation & Maintenance of the Family
- •Preservation of the Home
- •Maintenance of Economic Stability
- •Preservation of Individual Rights
- •Maintenance of Safety and Health
- •Provision for Devolution of Property
- •Enhancement of Community Development

The statement of priorities was reviewed by the Board of Directors on December 11, 2025. After discussion, the Board unanimously approved a motion to maintain the priorities as listed above. Nevertheless, ALSC having considered the 45CFR 1620.5 factors in evaluating the types of cases currently being handled by the General Law Unit, finds that reducing the problem codes in 2026 to the list provided below will enable more meaningful as well as the timely representation of our clients. The case types previously handled would no longer be accepted but would be referred to other programs or providers in the area.

- 2. 02 Collection/Repossession/Deficiency/Garnishment
- 3. 87 Expungements
- 4. 01 Bankruptcy/Debt Relief

In 2025, we expanded outreach efforts by continuing to utilize our two Justice Buses, especially in rural parishes that are "legal deserts" and where our intake numbers per indigent population are low. Additionally, we updated our website and other social media outlets to solicit input from the client community to identify systemic issues.
